






Overcoming Barriers Involved in Chronic Pain Management

Chronic Pain Experience

Understand access to covered treatment and services for people with chronic pain.

This visual is derived from stakeholder interviews focusing on the experiences of those living with and treating chronic pain. Its intent is to highlight the most prominent barriers experienced by people accessing care and the influencers acting on providers, ultimately affecting the person with chronic pain, their quality of care, and their quality of life. These sentiments were derived from requests for information (RFIs) conducted by CMS and CDC, including as part of CDC's efforts to understand and integrate the lived experiences of patients and providers into their update to the 2016 opioid prescribing guideline.



* CDC is in the process of updating the 2016 CDC Guideline for Prescribing Opioids for Chronic Pain. The goal of the revised clinical practice guideline is to help advance effective, individualized, patient-centered care. The revision was designed with a focus on ensuring appropriate use as a clinical tool and to avoid misapplication of the guideline itself.

Overcoming Barriers Involved in Chronic Pain Management

COE's purpose is to offer support and provide resources to help overcome these barriers and improve care for people who live with chronic pain.

Barriers for patients

- Lack of providers to manage chronic pain
 - Providers opting out of managing pain
 - Lack of access to Pain Specialists in rural areas
 - Current provider retires leaving them without care
- Lack of access to comprehensive, holistic therapies
 - o Interventional treatmentso PT/OT
 - o Behavioral health

Barriers for providers

- Hesitation to manage pain, esp. high MME's
- Insufficient insurance coverage/reimbursement for services
- Punitive regulatory environment/misapplication of 2016
 CDC practice guidelines
- Opportunity for increased confidence in prescribing
 opioids beyond acute pain indications
 - Lack of resources/ education available

Resources Available through Chronic Pain Centers of Excellence

- **Education:** Training/ education for Primary Care providers on best practices in opioid prescribing to increase confidence in management of chronic pain
 - 2-hour CME/CE on-demand webinar accredited for physicians, nurse practitioners/ registered nurses, physician assistants, and pharmacists
 - Part 1: Best Practices in Opioid Prescribing
 - Part 2: Tapering Recommendations and Patient Cases
- **Support:** Pain management consults with Pain Specialist Physician/PharmD for complex cases
 - Initial and follow-up consults available if needed
- **Connection to care:** Referral coordinator to facilitate member/RAE connections for behavioral health services and multidisciplinary care



Chronic Pain Centers of Excellence Workflow/Referral Process for Complex Pain Consults



Referral Coordinator: Judy Mooney Email: judy.mooney@state.co.us



Chronic Pain Centers of Excellence <u>Prior Authorization</u> vs. <u>COE Pain Consults</u>

Prescription written requires PA d/t not meeting Medicaid criteria*

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Provider's office calls CO Medicaid/Magellan PA phone number and speaks with representative.

Criteria not met for Magellan pharmacist to approve, so pain consult requested and sent to Pain Specialist Physician/PharmD.

Pain Specialist Physician/PharmD calls provider and does peer-to-peer to determine coverage/alternative. Provider inherits/agrees to manage a patient with chronic pain

Patient case is complex, and provider would feel more comfortable managing with support via consult with a specialist.

Provider emails Chronic Pain COE Referral Coordinator requesting pain consult through COE with pertinent patient information.

Pain Specialist physician calls provider and conducts consult via phone.

*CO Medicaid requires PA for: opioid naïve 4th fill, short-acting opioid > #120/30 days, MME>200, non-preferred meds

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
